James started square dancing in 2003, and dances through the Plus level. James started calling in the summer of 2016 when wife, Janice, signed him up for a new caller seminar at the IL State Square Dance Convention. He's been calling for 7 years now. James finds most music, via a website <u>www.musicforcallers.com</u> which provides

links to numerous different music production companies (labels) that produce square dance music. James purchases music from labels such as Arrowhead Recording, Chic Recording, Royal Records, Rhythm Records, Acme and Crest Recording, New Beat, Elmer Sheffield Productions, Riverboat Square Dance Music, Fine Tune Records, Goldwing Records, Blue Star and EGO Recordings.

Often, he will hear a piece of music being played at a dance by another caller and decide he likes the tune and asks the caller for the title of the song and the label, and purchases it. Most square dance music comes in MP3s, so it's a simple task to download the music. James currently works as an attorney for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and has been with that agency for 31 years. James also met his oldest friend, Timothy Chapman, through work at the U.S. EPA in April 1993. He (Chapman) now is a veteran federal prosecutor (currently prosecuting high profile public corruption cases in Chicago).
